<p>Federal and State Grants are awarded to students who demonstrate financial need as determined by the information received from the FAFSA.</p> <p>Work-study jobs are also awarded to students with financial need and are limited by the funds received by Temple College from the federal government.</p> <p>Scholarships can be merit or need based or a combination of both and require students to apply.</p> <p>Loans are available to all students as a last resort regardless of financial need.</p>	<p>What is Financial Aid?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Federal and State Grants (PELL, SEOG, TPEG, ACG) * Work-study jobs * Scholarships * Loans
<p>Students are required to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at the Department of Education website.</p> <p>The form has been simplified and provides explicit directions and locations for students to find the required financial information. Accuracy is crucial!</p> <p>The application is FREE...students should never pay to complete the FAFSA or to find free money for college.</p>	<p>How do I get Financial Aid?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at: www.FAFSA.ed.gov • Application is free • Help is available in the Financial Aid Office <p><u>BEWARE OF SCAMS</u> requiring fees to complete the FAFSA or help you find financial aid resources.</p>
<p>Students and parents must adhere to important deadlines to maximize financial aid awarding opportunities. All deadline information is available on the Temple College website.</p> <p>The FAFSA must be completed every year, beginning January 1st for the following academic year.</p>	<p>When do I apply for Financial Aid?</p> <p>Temple College application deadlines:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">Fall Semester - June 1 Spring Semester - November 1 Summer Semester - April 1</p> <p>The FAFSA must be completed every year!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Be filled out accurately to avoid time delays and extra steps.</u>
<p>You should complete the FAFSA even if you think you may not qualify for financial aid. Completion of the FAFSA is the key to unlocking money...money...money!!!</p>	<p>Why should I apply for Financial Aid?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Most scholarship applications require completion of the FAFSA • Nothing to lose; everything to gain • A total of \$20+ million was awarded at Temple College last year • Further YOUR education for a better future
<p>How will I receive my Refund?</p> <p>Money disbursed from Temple College is available via check or Direct Deposit. Checks will be automatically sent to the address on file with Admissions and Records. <p>[Cut to view of One College Centre and visual walk to the doors of Financial Aid]</p>	
<p>[Fade out and into two high school students talking at a lunch table]</p>	
<p>Student #1: "I really want to go to college but I just don't know how we can afford it? My counselor says there is free money available, but I just don't know where to start."</p>	
<p>Student #2: "It really isn't that hard. My parents had to help my brother get started and lucky for you and me...I watched and listened. We have to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.FAFSA.ed.gov using last years' earnings information, answer all the questions completely, and choose Temple College for the information to be sent to."</p>	
<p>Student #1: "Is that it?"</p>	
<p>Student #2: "Almost...once our information is processed, they will let us know that it is being sent to the Financial Aid Office at Temple College. If they need any information from us they'll let us know."</p>	
<p>Student #1: "Like what kind of information?"</p>	
<p>Student #2: "My brother had to turn in a copy of my parents' tax return and a Dependent Verification Worksheet where he answered several questions about our family, income, and assets. It was easy."</p>	
<p>Student #1: "You make it sound easy, but I get confused with stuff like that."</p>	
<p>Student #2: "The Financial Aid Office staff helped answer all my brother and parents' questions. They told him what to expect, when to expect it, and really made it simple. They understand that sometimes dealing with finances and the government can be confusing, but they were happy to help get it all together for them."</p>	
<p>"If you don't believe me, just look at their Financial Aid website, which has all the links, steps, information, documents & forms. You can read it to help you understand."</p>	
<p>Student #1: "Wow, it does sound easier than I thought. I guess I was just blowing it out of proportion (...with a sigh).</p>	
<p>Student #2: "Well, they don't call you 'Drama Queen' for nothing (...laughs). I'll see you after classes and we can both get started on our FAFSAs...the sooner we get it done the better! [Pan off to students walking down the hallway]</p>
